Our Mission

Horizon House is a full-service agency that connects our homeless neighbors with integrated, comprehensive services. We provide a safe place and basic services for our community's homeless—serving them with dignity and respect, as they take steps towards a more stable life.

Our Vision

Everyone in the Greater Indianapolis area has a place and a recognized value and is treated with hospitality, respect and dignity. Our community unites to provide everyone access to resources to meet life's critical needs and to empower each individual to reach his or her potential. Our priority is that no individual is homeless.

Summary of Programs

Street Outreach Rapid Response Team (SORRT)

Since March 2011, SORRT has coordinated the efforts of several professional outreach teams to better address the needs of unsheltered individuals who have been referred by IMPD, hospitals, and other organizations in the City. SORRT engages with homeless

neighbors wherever they are in need of assistance: in camps, under bridges, in the woods, and in emergency rooms. When needed, the outreach team provides basic life-sustaining supplies such as blankets, water, emergency food kits, and clothing. Through assessment and intensive case management services, SORRT has been instrumental in connecting neighbors to primary medical

care and mental health and/or substance abuse services, achieving improved outcomes for neighbors while reducing the use of public resources.

Case Management Encounters

Triage Case Management

Following an orientation to the many services that are provided by Horizon House and our co-located partners, each new neighbor meets with a triage case manager for an assessment of their individual needs—such as clothing, identification documents, and transportation—and how to most efficiently address those needs. Case managers also make referrals for critical services such as shelter, medical and mental health care, legal services, and vocational and employment programs. In addition to conducting initial assessments, triage case managers are also available to assist neighbors with meeting immediate and short term needs any time during their enrollment.

Horizon House recognizes the unique challenges faced by military veterans experiencing homelessness and maintains partnerships with several agencies dedicated exclusively to serving veterans. Through a specialized Triage Case Manager/Veterans Resource Coordinator, veterans receive an assessment and are connected with local, state, and federal programs for which they qualify based on their military service.

Opportunity Knocks

Opportunity Knocks (OK) provides neighbors with the chance to pursue their educational and employment goals in an atmosphere that promotes professionalism and learning. Opportunity Knocks Job Readiness Training assists neighbors in setting attainable vocational goals and learning the skills needed to obtain employment. These skills include filling out applications, creating a resume, practicing interview skills, managing stress, and conducting a successful job search. The employment lab is available on a daily basis, providing resources and assistance that allow neighbors to participate in job search activities that are increasingly dependent on internet connectivity. Opportunity Knocks also provides ongoing support through Vocational Case Management services that have proven to be critical in helping individuals build community connections, earn training certifications and achieve success in securing and retaining jobs that lead to long-term self-sufficiency.

Housing Relocation & Support Program

Horizon House neighbors who are ready to secure stable housing and become self-sufficient have the opportunity to engage with Intensive Case Management services to develop a personalized, goal-oriented plan that addresses their barriers while building on their unique strengths. As part of the planning process, case managers help to identify housing resources that best meet each individual's need. Neighbors work with their case manager to create a goal plan that may help repair damaged credit, coordinate medical and/or mental health services, retain or obtain income from employment or assistance programs, and address transportation barriers. All plans include strategies for connecting the neighbor with community resources to help ensure long-term housing stability after their transition from the Housing Relocation & Support Program.

Basic Engagement Services

Everyone needs daily hygiene, food, and shelter—meeting these needs is the primary basis of our interactions with homeless neighbors. Horizon House offers a safe place, out of the elements, to take care of these and other personal needs. In 2013, Horizon House provided facilities for neighbors to take 8,591 showers and wash 4,504 loads of clothes—free of charge. We ask our neighbors to sign up for shower and laundry time; this helps them re-establish accountability and allows everyone an opportunity to use the facilities. The agency also provides donated toiletries and clothing. These services are offered in an atmosphere of dignity and respect.

Horizon House makes a point to provide our daily staple—bread, peanut butter, and jelly, along with hot coffee and water, for neighbors. Since we partner with other excellent agencies, we do not routinely provide hot meals. We do not want to duplicate the good works others are doing.

One of the most important elements of basic services is mail delivery to our building for our neighbors. Many neighbors would not have access to their mail if it were not delivered to Horizon House. Neighbors are also able to make local phone calls from within the day room.

In 2013, Horizon House provided access to these important services to an average of 162 neighbors each day. Basic services help to relieve stress as well as the physical and emotional demands of homelessness. The atmosphere of hospitality in which basic services are offered fosters trust, which in turn lays the groundwork for case management and other services offered to help our neighbors confront and overcome the barriers and challenges they face. Through Orientation, neighbors are informed of services and assistance available at Horizon House, and the processes by which to access and use them. Neighbors are also informed of expected behavior, which keeps it a safe place for everyone.

Access to basic services is also the first step for those neighbors living on the streets that our outreach team encounters. The outreach team works to build trusting relationships with these individuals to encourage them to come into a facility like Horizon House to take care of daily needs. Horizon House basic services—offered with hospitality and respect for all—set the stage for everything else we do.

Elnora's Journey

When Elnora lost her job as a nursing assistant, she didn't know where to turn. She moved to Indiana from another state and did not have a Certified Nursing Assistant certificate, which was needed in Indiana to perform her line of work. Her money was running low, causing her to lose her apartment. It was a scary situation for her. For a number of months, Elnora lived in her car. She heard about Horizon House and started visiting each day to do her laundry, take a shower, and get some nourishment. Visiting Horizon House also helped Elnora gain some consistency and direction.



As Elnora transitioned from utilizing basic services to working one-on-one with a case manager, she was referred to a women's shelter for overnight space. As a result of her experience with basic services, she trusted the Horizon House staff to continue to walk with her and provide the help needed for her to keep making positive progress. As Elnora continued utilizing our services for mail delivery and more, she worked with a case manager to get her career back on track. Elnora needed to pass an Adult Basic Education test to be eligible for the Certified Nurse's Assistant training and certification. However, Elnora felt her English and math skills were very rusty since she had been out of the classroom for a number of years. Horizon House was able to match her with a college student who tutored her on these subjects to help her gain confidence. Elnora's journey had its ups and downs, but she continued to persevere. Ultimately she passed the Adult Basic Education test and started her official nurse's assistant training. Elnora is now on her way towards her desired career and self-sufficiency. This journey all started with basic services and engagement by Horizon House staff.

2013 9th Annual Tackling Homelessness

On Monday, September 9th, 2013, the 9th Annual Tackling Homelessness Event was held at the Colts Training Facility. We are pleased to announce that 2013 garnered the best results ever for this event! Horizon House netted \$147,780! We greatly appreciate Indiana Grand Racing & Casino being the Presenting Sponsor for this event. During the evening they announced that Indiana Grand

2013 Community Partner Award: Buckingham Companies

Each year Horizon House honors a community organization that has made significant contributions in helping Horizon House to fulfill its mission. In 2013, Horizon House was honored to present Buckingham Companies with the Community Partner Award in recognition of a very engaged group of individuals that demonstrated true leadership, commitment, and passion for serving our homeless neighbors.

We have been so honored to work with Buckingham Companies and The Alexander hotel. During the holiday season, Horizon House was chosen as the benefitting agency for the organization's 2013 Charity Champion competition. Various apartment properties and corporate office floors competed with each other by donating specific items to Horizon House. Each item had a point value associated with it, and the points accumulated to produce the final winner. On Giving

Tuesday, Buckingham Companies provided an all-day radio remote at The Alexander featuring Horizon House. Listeners stopped by to donate funds and goods. For CityWay's Holiday Open House, Horizon House was once again featured as the benefitting charity during the event.



After the completion of the 2013 Charity Champion competition, Horizon House was honored to receive many boxes of needed donations and a check for \$5,000. In addition, we worked with Buckingham Foundation and were awarded a grant for our employment program to help homeless neighbors gain tools needed to re-enter the job market.

Buckingham Companies and The Alexander employees also committed to volunteer at Horizon House every quarter to help in needed areas. They have assisted us with performing mock interviews for job candidates, organizing our donation center, cleaning the day room and kitchen areas, and now are even utilizing their expertise to paint offices for us.

We are so impressed by Buckingham Companies and The Alexander for their level of commitment and passion for helping better the community. This group goes above and beyond to get things done and help those who need it the most.

2013 Madonna Minion Award: Misty Fuller

Madonna Minion was a former Guest Service Associate of Horizon House whose love for others was demonstrated through her commitment to serving neighbors with compassion, dignity, and respect. In her honor, the Madonna Minion Award was established to recognize staff members who also demonstrate this passion to serve our neighbors.



Each year the staff votes for a coworker that shares many attributes with Madonna Minion: compassion and willingness to listen to neighbor's concerns, dedication to the mission, being a team player, and having a positive attitude.

In 2013, Misty Fuller was voted the recipient of the Madonna Minion Award. Misty's role, as the Employment Center Specialist, includes helping neighbors update resumes through one-on-one meetings, encouraging neighbors in their job search, and teaching a weekly class on how to obtain and keep employment. Misty's dedication is unequalled in her attention and energy towards helping our neighbors find jobs. She is an outstanding advocate for our neighbors as she works towards helping them reach their goals.

One of the most unique things about Misty is that she gives everyone a chance. In her daily schedule, she creates as much time as she can for individualized attention for neighbors seeking to regain the job market. This one-on-one time helps neighbors build confidence and persistence in their job search. Misty found that many of the neighbors we help through our employment program are overcoming big odds to find employment. For this reason, Misty devoted herself to helping each neighbor she worked with find that success through finding a job. In 2013, nearly 200 neighbors went through the Job Readiness Training class taught by Misty. We are very proud of her efforts and her passion for helping our neighbors. This passion was noticed by all the Horizon House staff and resulted in Misty receiving this great award.

2013 Meador Volunteer Award Recipient: Randy Jekel

Randy Jekel is an outstanding volunteer for Horizon House. It doesn't matter what we may need at any given time, Randy comes to the rescue securing vital resources. He is truly one of a kind! Randy will do whatever is needed to help homeless neighbors we serve.

Randy purchases and donates many items throughout the year depending on what our need is at the time. He also volunteers on our behalf at the Perry Township Trustee's office in order to secure needed items for Horizon House from their warehouse supply.



Randy is not afraid to request special needs Horizon House may have, and in fact meets some of those needs himself. For example, when Randy took a trip to Michigan this past winter, he stayed at a hotel and asked if they had any travel size body lotion they could donate, but nothing seemed to be immediately available. An hour after Randy checked out of the hotel, the hotel staff called to let him know that they had indeed found a box of lotion to donate. By

that time, Randy was too far away to turn back; however, when he returned home, he found that the box of lotion had been mailed to him! Another example: When Randy found out that our Outreach Team rode bikes to visit camp sites, he donated air pumps and bike locks. He also paid for a bicycle maintenance class for outreach team members.

Randy is always willing to go and pick up donations for us, as he did this past fall during our coat and blanket drive. When several senior citizens wanted to donate items but had no way to get them to us. As soon as we mentioned this to Randy, he volunteered to go pick up their donations! We are so grateful that Horizon House is the recipient of all the kind deeds Randy does on behalf of homeless neighbors.

The Meador Volunteer Award was established in 1996 to honor Jay Meador's (Founding Chairman of the Board of Horizon House) integrity and commitment to helping the homeless, and to acknowledge those whose outstanding volunteer work for Horizon House is a continuation of the standards he set.

Horizon House began serving the community in 1988 as a solution to addressing homelessness in Indianapolis. At the time, Horizon House was called the Indianapolis Day Center and was operated through cooperative efforts of Shepherd Community and the Salvation Army. As the needs of the clientele it served changed, Horizon House



developed into a secularized agency to broaden its base for support. In 1997, the Board of Directors voted to become a United Way of Central Indiana agency and changed the name to Horizon House.

We are honored to serve the community as a service provider for homeless neighbors. It has been a privilege to be part of the many successes experienced by our neighbors who were empowered to improve their health, achieve stability and find permanent housing. We are grateful to a caring community that has supported our efforts in many ways, and without which, our work would not be possible. We continue to see Horizon House as the solution for so many homeless neighbors in Central Indiana and we look forward to our next 25 years of service. 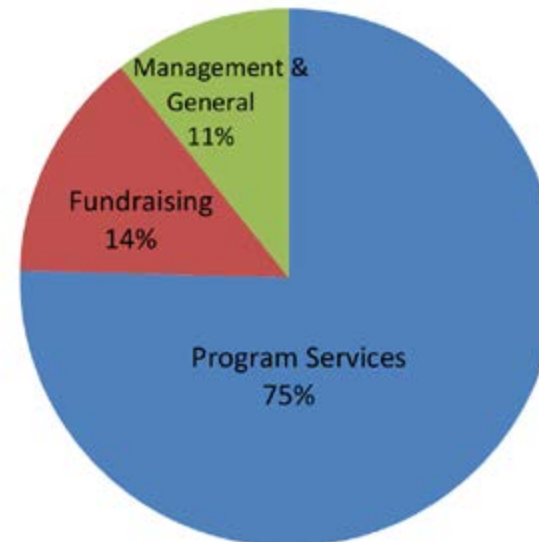
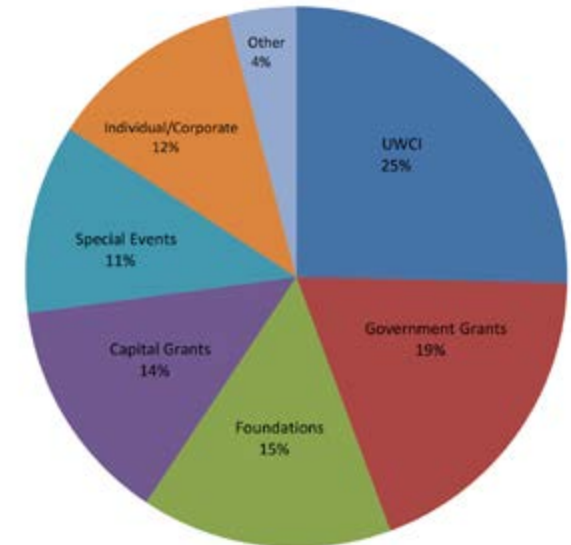
